

ACTIVE SHOOTER RESPONSE

RUN

- Have an escape route and plan in mind
- Leave your belongings behind
- Take your keys and cell phone if it doesn't delay your escape
- Keep your hands visible – raise them above your head

HIDE

- In an area out the the shooter's view
- Block entry to your hiding place and lock the doors, if possible
- Silence cell phone and/or pager

FIGHT (Take Action)

- As a last resort and only when your life is in danger
- Attempt to incapacitate the active shooter
- Act with physical aggression and throw items as the shooter

When Law Enforcement Arrives

- Remain calm, and follow instructions
- Put down any items in your hand (i.e., bags, jackets)
- Immediately raise hands and spread fingers
- Keep hands visible at all times
- Avoid making quick movements toward officers such as holding on to them for safety
- Avoid pointing, screaming or yelling
- Don't stop to ask officers for help or direction when evacuating; proceed in the direction from where officers are entering the building/area

Information to Provide Law Enforcement or 9-1-1 Operator

- Location of the active shooter/s
- Number of shooters
- Physical description of the shooter/s
- Number and type of weapons possessed by the shooter/s
- Number of potential victims and their locations
